
Broadstreet Publishing Group is coloring outside the lines with new ventures

- When Treasures
Bookstore closed its
doors in Downtown
Racine two years ago,
it wasn't the end of
the story for Jerry
Blooms' inspirational
bookstore business.
Rather, it represented
the turning of the page
to a new chapter as
Bloom shifted his focus
to book distribution and
publishing.

After Treasures shuttered its Monument Square location in 2014, Bloom and a former vendor founded a new venture, Broadstreet Publishing Group (www. broadstreetpublishing.com). The publishing company, whose slogan is "inspire the world around you," publishes Christian and inspirational books. Under the name Belle City Gifts, Broadstreet

> cancer. Broadstreet also has launched a new line of children's books. the "Middle School Rules" series, which highlight the childhood adventures of adult athletes. The first two books in the series feature the childhood stories of retired Chicago Bears linebacker Brian Urlacher and Carolina Panthers cornerback Charles Tillman.

"It's like 'Diary of a Wimpy Kid,' but nonfiction," said Bloom, who explained that they have an "if I can do it, you can too" message to encourage kids to pursue their dreams.

Newest books

Broadstreet has a new

Bible translation, "The Passion Translation," based on a combination of Greek, Hebrew and Aramaic texts. Eight volumes, each featuring several books of the Bible, have already been issued, and the entire New Testament should be available within two years, he said.

Digital products

Broadstreet is expanding beyond printed books and journals, too, by producing digital audiobooks. Unlike audiobooks in CD form, digital audiobooks have no physical format but, instead, are downloaded from sites such as iTunes or Audible, explained Bloom.
